Care of God's Creation-- Water

71 percent of the Earth's surface is covered with water. We think of Earth as "the blue planet" and of water as an infinite resource. But in fact, Earth is a closed system. Very little matter--to include water--ever leaves or enters the atmosphere. Only about 2.5 % of Earth's water is fresh (not saline). An astoundingly smaller amount--.3%-- is useable by humans and much of that is unattainable. Water consumed today is the same water consumed in ages past and the same water we will have for use in the future. Cleaned and replenished through Earth's hydrologic cycle, fresh water is renewable by rainfall.

Water used by humans historically comes from rivers (surface water), but fresh water is more prevalent under ground as soil moisture and in aquifers. About 20 percent of water used globally is now from underground resources (renewable or not). This share is rapidly rising, particularly in dry areas.

The approximate distribution of all water on Earth is:

- Ocean water: 97.2 percent
- Glaciers and other ice: 2.15 percent
- Groundwater,: 0.61 percent
- Fresh water lakes: 0.009 percent
- Inland seas: 0.008 percent
- Soil Moisture: 0.005 percent
- Atmosphere: 0.001 percent
- Rivers: 0.0001 percent.

Water use is uneven among countries. According to the United Nations World Water Development Report 3, the 10 largest users (by volume) are: India, China, USA, Pakistan, Japan, Thailand, Indonesia, Bangladesh, Mexico, and the Russian Federation.

Irrigated agriculture is by far the main use for water--accounting for 70 percent of water withdrawals worldwide and up to 90 percent in some regions. Industry and energy production account for 20 percent of water use. An increase in agricultural output required over the next few decades to meet food and fuel needs of an expanding global population is projected to be limited not by scarcity of land, or labor, but by scarcity of water.

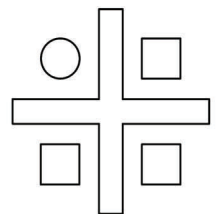
