### RETIREMENT/NURSING HOME MINISTRY

If a desire to bring joy and comfort to Catholics who would like to receive the Eucharist but can not get to church would interest you, we have a perfect opportunity for you.

We are presently looking for a few volunteers who would be willing to bring communion to five to eight residents at Trinity Retirement Center when one of our regular distributors is unavailable. Or, if you should have a desire to fulfill this ministry on a weekly basis we could provide you with your very own list of residents to see. The residents are always so grateful to receive Holy Communion and be visited by a St Luke parishioner. At present there are 46 Catholic residents at Trinity and seven regular distributors.

As a **substitute distributor**, only one or two hours of your time on an occasional weekday would be needed. As a **regular distributor**, one or two hours each week, usually on Thursday. If interested, please call Mary Lou Kramer at 429-2992.

### Care of the Earth--Water Facts

According to the United Nations, *2.5 billion people, including 1 billion children, live without even basic sanitation.* Every 20 seconds, a child dies as a result of poor sanitation. At any given moment, almost half the rural population in East Africa is suffering from an illness related to lack of clean water.

In 2006, 54 percent of dwellings had water piped in to the house or yard, 33 percent had other improved drinking water sources, and 884 million people had unimproved sources. Improvements in drinking water sources are steadily being made, but *by 2015 UNESCO estimates that 2.4 billion people will still be without basic sanitation.*

Two uses of water--irrigation and thermoelectric-power production,--accounted for about 79 percent of water used in the U.S. in 2000 according to the U.S. Geological Survey. Water-use by category: **irrigation--40%, thermoelectric power--39%, public water supply--13%, Industry--5%, Livestock/aqua culture--less than 1%, Domestic (self-supplied)--1%, and mining--1%.** The large amount of water used for power (electricity) is mostly used to cool the heated power-production equipment and is returned to the environment, available for other uses.

**In 2000, California accounted for almost 11 % of all freshwater used in the U.S.** Most of the water used in California was for crop irrigation-- **22 % of all the Nation's irrigation water was used in California**, indicating how important agriculture is there. Florida, also a large food producer, gets more summer rainfall than the Central Valley of California, so there is less need for irrigation. California led the Nation in acres irrigated, followed by Nebraska and Texas.

**California, Texas, Idaho, and Illinois, together accounted for 28 percent of all fresh water used in the U.S. in 2000.** The three most populated states, California, Texas, and New York accounted for 30 percent of all water withdrawn for public-supply home and business use. Texas, Wyoming, and Oklahoma used the most water for mining, and California, Michigan, and Florida used the most water for household purposes.

In London leaks from ageing water mains are wasting 300 Olympic swimming pools' worth of water every day, the World Water Forum (WWF) says. **A water leakage rate of 50 percent is not uncommon in urban water distribution systems.** The World Business Council for Sustainable Development estimates that the cost of updating existing water and sanitation infrastructure in developed countries could be as much as \$200 billion per year--and the cost to the USA over the next 20 years to bring this infrastructure up to current standards would be 1 trillion dollars (excluding dams, dikes, and waterway maintenance). WWF urges water conservation on a global scale and asks rich states to set an example by repairing ageing water infrastructure and tackling pollution.

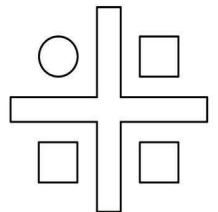
