Contrary to what you might have experienced or thought, older people have a much better and more balanced emotional approach to life and the circumstances they encounter. Although memory function may decline with age, emotional stability increases, according to a study reported in the Journal of Neuroscience (Volume 26, page 6422). Forget the myth that older people are crankier than younger ones. In fact, the reverse is true: Age brings increased emotional equanimity. The study provides a reminder that persistently negative moods in older people are not a normal part of aging.

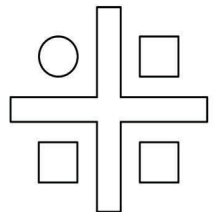
